## Story **Board**

#### East Texas Rep - K13 - Kevin Boatman

One of the things I love most about Geocaching is that it doesn't require planning to have a great adventure. One of mine started with a coin flip. It involved high altitudes, meeting geocachers from all over the country, being awakened by the local police at 3am, running up over 2,300 miles on the rented car, all while visiting 4 other states.

In early July of 2016, I was working in Midland and had the idea of going to Guadalupe Peak and on to El Paso for the holiday weekend of the Fourth of July. A couple weeks earlier, I had looked at the geocaching website for caching opportunities further out west, and saw something about GeoWoodstock in Denver. The idea of going to my first Geocaching Mega Event was interesting, but I dismissed it.

I had already rented a car and packed for some light camping on Thursday, so when I finished at the courthouse in Pecos, I was ready for adventure. When I got in the car, the idea of GeoWoodstock came back. Hmmm. I flipped a coin, heads: El Paso, tails: Denver. The quarter showed I was heading North instead of West. GeoWoodstock was now my destination.

I made it to Roswell before it was time to sleep. Roswell had their "Alien Festival" on Saturday, so I was lucky to find a motel room. I checked the phone app for geocaches along my route toward Denver. The next morning, I grabbed a couple local caches, then headed for an event atop Pikes Peak.

After a few caches and a few hundred miles, I arrived at Pikes Peak just in time to sign the log for the event. After finding all the available caches nearby, I amassed seven different cache types above 14,000 feet elevation. On the way down, I stopped for a cache and met some geocachers from Nebraska.

When I got back down to the park entry, I helped them hook to their camper, and we parted ways for the evening. I figured I would find a hotel near the Woodstock location. For most of the way from Colorado Springs to Denver I tried to find a hotel near my destination. LOL! (Note to self: impromptu excursions on major holiday weekends are not advisable if you want a hotel.)

With the lack of hotel availability, I decided to sleep in the car. A Sports Authority parking lot called out to me. Around 2:30 am, I was awakened by a loud alarm in the building. I look around, but didn't see any other vehicles, so I wasn't concerned. Just as I got back to sleep, the police came knocking on my window. They had me get out, prove my identity and explain my presence. About thirty minutes later, they left me alone and I tried to get back to sleep.

Around daybreak, I headed over to GeoWoodstock and got in line to park. While waiting, I walked around talking to others and finding a few geocaches before they finally opened the gates to the parking lot. I had a fun day at the event, meeting folks from all over the place, and finding some of the various caches placed in the Park. I even found one of the no-longer-allowed Traveling Caches, some of the first iteration of Lab Caches, and saw the OCB (Original Can of Beans). It was a fun day.

I caught up with my Nebraska friends from Pikes Peak, and we headed for a tree-climb cache across Denver. After that fun, we said goodbyes, and I headed toward Mingo. I made it to Limon, Colorado and stopped for the night.

Monday morning took me to Mingo, then it was a right turn, South toward Midland, and a very long day of driving to get back home. The words from the America the Beautiful monument atop Pikes Peak played through my head. This Fourth of July weekend, I had been upon the purple mountains majesty and had driven through amber waves of grain.

When I returned the rental car, the counter agent at the rental office was quite surprised to see that I had driven over 2,300 miles in four days. I told her it would have only been about 700, except for the flip of a coin.

I have other such tales to tell, like the trip to Ft. Jackson, South Carolina when I found some tough old caches - Octopus Garden, Lake Lanier, LPS001, Lara's Tomb and a few others – all while on a knee scooter due to recovering from a cut Achilles tendon, or my 15-state journey to the Indy 500 last year.

I know I will have more adventures. I hope you get out there for adventures of your own, whether planned or on a whim. I'll wager your odds of a great time are better than a coin flip.




