This cache was in Louisiana, a 2006 find, not long after I started caching. I found this cache after work one day on our way back to the yard. My helper and fellow geocacher was asleep on the side of the road in the truck where I left him and started my journey to this cache. He didn't wake up until I got back after my adventure and asked me what happened, why was I all dirty and sweaty. All I could do was laugh and say I went and found Big Rock Cache (GCKN9N).

Well, here is the story that I got to tell about my little - or not so little - journey to your cache.

As it goes, I came in the wrong way: GPS says 520', so off I went. Came upon a hobo camp in the woods, then all their body waste that was nasty. I went down the hill to the tracks; had to climb over train tracks and thru the cars. Then, I look up and there is this massive hill I got to climb. Reminded me of the Arkansas mountains. Oh look, only a 138' to the cache. So, off I went like the addicted geo nut I am, straight to the top. Dang the tree cover and I'm thinking I have to go back down all this and back the way I came. Boy, did I mess up. Well, at the top, I hear the cars on the other highway I'm suppose to come in on. Cool, let's find this and get out of here. After a little search, I see the cache spot. SL and off I went back up the hill to the top and I look down and all I see is a 70 ft drop. Dang.

Well, then my military skills came into play. Off I went; lip after lip, edge after edge and a few close calls. I made it to the bottom. Thank goodness for all the training the Marines gave me. I think back about the drill instructor saying, "The things you learn today may save your life or others in the future". So true and to think I said, "Yeah, right, whatever." Boy, was I wrong. Then back across I go thru the train that starts moving as I'm crossing it. Boy! Boy! Off I jump and off to the other hill I have to climb back up thru briars that I fell down through earlier (I forgot to mention that). As I'm getting to the top, I notice an object lying on the ground: a knife. I stop and look around for a minute or two to see if anyone is there, but nothing moves. So, I grab the knife and off to the truck I go. I'm out of breath now. I probably couldn't put up much of a fight if I had to. Yeah, right. You learn to fight holding your breath for extended periods of time in the Marines. I got back without really any problems. Will finish later battery low.

Well, I'm back and to finish, I made it safely to my truck but just before my wife calls and asks, "Why are you out of breath?' I said I was working at getting the cache. One minute turned into 45 and alot of exercise. My helper got worried and decided to come look for me. I arrived at the truck as he returned. SHHHH had to get some wawawa after that little journey!

my own geocaching series? Thus, "Around the World" was born—a puzzle-based journey that combined real-world locations, digital sleuthing, and a good sprinkle of global

curiosity.

I started small, with a simple geo-art of circles. Each cache highlighted a unique place some were on my personal travel bucket list, while others came from hours of research, picking regions I knew little about but felt deserved the spotlight. I wanted to represent all corners of the world fairly. And to keep things interesting, I nudged the difficulty just a bit higher than a quick Google image search could handle-enough to challenge, but not overwhelm.

I set the caches to publish in groups of 2 or 3 every single day for weeks. Creating the series became a therapeutic hobby. Each location I researched felt like a mini escape, a little postcard from a world I couldn't yet explore in person. But once I completed all the circles, my imagination kept flying. So, naturally, I added a little airplane looping around the globe to complete the geo-art with a total of 141 caches. After all, what's a world tour without a flight?

To my delight, the community response was incredible. Geocachers reached out asking for hints, sharing their excitement, and even sending heartfelt notes about how much joy and distraction the puzzles brought during tough times. That connection—between people, places, and play—has been the most rewarding part of it all.

So, while Around the World started as a way to pass the time in isolation, it turned into a shared adventure. And honestly? I still haven't packed my bags, but thanks to this series,

I've already taken one amazing trip around the globe.


- Taylor was established in 1876 with the arrival of the International-Great Northern Railroad and was named after Edward Moses Taylor, a railroad official.
- Immigrants from Czechoslovakia, Slavic states, Germany, and Austria played a significant role in the city's early development.
- Despite a devastating fire in 1879, Taylor rebuilt and even flourished, adding more substantial buildings and attracting more businesses.
- Frederick Bean "Tex" Avery, a key creator of iconic animated characters like Bugs Bunny and Daffy Duck, was from Taylor.
- Taylor boasts a charming downtown area with Heritage Square Park, perfect for leisurely strolls.







