MsPatt has traveled many miles across Texas counties for a smiley! I have even gone back a second time across Texas counties for a second cache for the Two-Step Challenge. So, road trips are part of my wheelhouse.

Magtfplanner contacted me with an invite to travel the back roads of Alaska (by air and water) with his crew, for 8 targeted counties. With Alaska being my 50th state - the last one I needed - I knew my answer was "Yes!", even before I finished my email response!

Fast forward: We landed in Ketchikan, Alaska at 11am and hit the road. The first Alaska cache was GC4F874 The Troll. We collected 3 Earthcaches and a handful of Traditionals, which gave us a grand tour of Ketchikan.

Morning found us boarding a ferry for a 24-hour ride. A 7-story ferry was a first for me. We had plenty of time to explore and experience the laidback Alaska time (like Island time). We got to stretch our legs in Wrangell, where within a 30-minute window, we collected 4 smileys and another county. I learned how to play Exploding Kittens and watched as Magtfplanner and Sanferic played giant-sized Chess. Next port, Petersburg: 1 smiley and a DNF.

We landed in Haines Alaska, a cute lil' Alaskan town. We secured the help of our Lyft driver for the outer distances, but otherwise, walked the complete town. Exploring the American Bald Eagle Foundation is a must do in Haines. Back on a smaller ferry to Skagway, we shopped, explored, hiked up mountain sides, and hiked to Gold Rush Cemetery, with a flowing waterfall at our fingertips.


The next morning found us catching a small aircraft, we could see over the Pilots shoulder the ice glacier fields and waterfalls as we headed to Juneau, the capital of Alaska. Lots to explore: The Mendenhall Glacier, Boardwalk, GC84EMM Capitol Stones - Juneau Earthcache #4.

We took another puddle jumper to Gustavus, where we spent some time at Glacier Bay National Park. We hiked 4 miles round trip for the FTF on a 2-year-old Earthcache GCABM3F Bartlett River Glacial Rebound: Magtfplanner with the Bear bells and MsPatt with the Bear Spray! We then hiked to a 1957 plane crash site and afterwards, hiked 2 miles roundtrip for a set of 4-year lonely caches. We experienced a glimpse of life where time stand still....

Once more, a 20-minute air ride to Sitka, home of the Oldest Cache in Alaska GC68 Centurion Guards, and GC6E Kids Geocache.

Another Alaskan town with fishing tours and whale watching, a must stop at Fortress of the Bears, a Bear Rescue center and GC9ZM8D The House of the Bears.

The weather was 65° during the day, perfect for long-sleeves Geocaching wear. Check back in April for the full story <u>HERE</u>.

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

CyberCat



Early in 2001, I was watching the TV show, 60 minutes. They were doing a story on a new activity called Geocaching. As I watched Barbara Walters crawling through the bushes to find a hidden box, I thought that looked like tons of fun. Right away, I signed up for an account, only to look at my area and see.....nothing. It took me a long time to figure out how to program my yellow eTrex. In the meantime, 2 caches had popped up on the map, so a friend and I set out to find them.

When we got to ground zero, there was nothing there. My friend was focused on finding whatever it was within a small group of trees. I was so disappointed I just started wandering around. About 50 feet away, I noticed a really strange-looking pile of rocks. I wondered if that could be it. When I began to pull the rocks away, I realized I had found it. I heard someone screaming. A couple of minutes later, I realized that was me, and I was still screaming. Well, that was it. I was hooked. And I'm still hooked.

I wanted to find more caches so bad, but there weren't any more! So, I got my kicks out of hiding. The geocachers in Austin noticed that there were new caches popping up in San Antonio, and the San Antonio cachers noticed that there were caches in Austin. So, we spent years traveling back and forth to get each others' caches and events. There was nothing much in between, so those two groups 'played' together for years. Now that caching has grown so much, we don't need to make those long drives anymore, but I sure do miss the camaraderie that had developed.

One of the funniest things I remember was the trip that I took with 4 other gal geocachers. We were out in Nevada in the desert. One of the cars didn't have 4WD and they kept getting stuck in the sand. They rounded a corner in deep sand, and we could see they were not going to get out anytime soon. We breezed on by them as they were yelling at us to stop and help them. Well, we didn't want to get stuck either, so we kept going around a hill. Shocked was not the best word to describe how we felt when we ran head on, into an army tank out on maneuvers, We explained our dilemma and they thought it was really funny that their 'mission' for the day was to rescue some geocachers who were stuck in the sand. As we rounded the corner, our friends were under the car putting sheets of cardboard under the tires. Their jaws hit the floor when they saw us bringing a tank to pull their car out of the sand. They forgave us pretty quickly for leaving them earlier.

Some of my most memorable caches were a fake bird poking his head out of a bridge support, a bellows in the woods, which you had to pump with your foot. When you pumped it enough, a pill bottle would shoot out of a nearby pipe. I remember a stick outside of a fence with the words PULL HARD. When you pulled, a volleyball would launch from its catapult hidden on the property behind the sign. You had to write your name on the volleyball and throw it back. And who could forget Line of Sight in Austin. Nothing was at ground zero except a kite stuck up in a tree. Only after following the kite string that was wrapped around about 15 different trees would the end of the string lead you to the final hiding place. Fake peepholes, fake doorknobs, fake light bulbs, a fake alligator that would growl, the creativity is just off the chart. Geocachers are the most creative people who keep coming up with ways to entertain each other.

I met my late husband, Steve, AKA Mogasman, at a geocaching event in 2010. We got married in Barbados in 2012. We planned our vacations around what we wanted to see and of equal importance, were there geocaches close by? It always worked out to be a great combination of sightseeing and caching. I was always taught not to brag on myself, but I will mention the greatest accomplishment Steve and I were able to complete. We went to all 7 continents and got caches in all of them. Sadly, he passed away recently so I'm not sure who I will cache with now. But there is never a shortage of people who want to go out for the day, so I'm sure that problem will take care of itself.





It's that time again!
