

One of the things I love most about geocaching is the incredible sense of community and teamwork you encounter wherever you go. It's amazing how complete strangers are willing to go out of their way to help one another—all because we share this fun, quirky game in common. That spirit is strong here in Texas, but I've seen it all over the world.

I could share countless examples from right here in Texas, but one of my favorite stories actually happened while I was on vacation. Back on Pi Day in 2015—3.14.15—Groundspeak released special souvenirs to celebrate the date. Souvenirs were still pretty new back then, so no one wanted to miss out. The catch was that I'd already planned a family trip to Grand Cayman for Spring Break that week.

One souvenir was for attending an event—no problem, I could host one myself. Another was for finding a Mystery cache—also easy enough, since I noticed there were a dozen or so on the island. But then I realized something interesting: all of those Mystery caches were owned by the same cacher, Mazza\_. That meant that while I could earn the souvenir, she couldn't—and that just didn't seem right.

So, I reached out to her and proposed an idea: she could hide a final, and I'd publish a Pi-themed Mystery cache on Pi Day. It worked perfectly! We both earned the souvenir, collaborated across borders, and even met in person at the Pi Day event I hosted.

But the story didn't end there. A couple of years later, Mazza\_ moved back to Missouri and archived her caches—leaving mine as the only Mystery cache on the island. With help from another local cacher I'd met at that same event, we kept it maintained for several more years, until the palm tree it was hidden in was eventually cut down.

To me, that experience really captures what makes geocaching special. It's not just about finding containers or earning souvenirs—it's about connecting with people, working together, and building a community that stretches across the world.

When asked about a memory that has stood out throughout their caching career, they recalled this mishap: It was rainy and dark and they pulled down the road to get a cache and got stuck in the mud. They spent the night in the van waiting for auto club that never showed up. The next morning, they called 911. The dispatcher said she couldn't do much but did call a farmer who used his tractor to pull them out!

You'll hear more about ZHR's biggest accomplishment in a separate special feature, finding a cache, not only in every state in the lower 48 (plus Hawaii), but in every county in those lower 48 states and 4 out of 5 counties in Hawaii! Wow!

Other accomplishments include: being #26 in the original Texas County Challenge back in 2010; finding a cache in every province of Canada, but one; attending geo-events (hosted by others) in 18 U.S. states, 5 Canadian provinces, and 1 in Mexico; and visiting all the U.S. National Parks, except for one – Channel Islands Park (two attempts were thwarted).

A favorite find of theirs is the virtual multi, where they found the final is at the bottom of Grand Canyon 15 years ago (see pic).

What now after those accomplishments? They'd love to go back to Canada to continue to explore!

Words of advice: "Get out and see the country!"

Also, go to geo-events, it's a great way to meet people."

Meet Zoothornrollo (Brian & Kris ) They've been married 48 years and knew each other 6 years before that, when they met as seniors in high school. They are retired teachers who have always enjoyed traveling. They camp in their vehicle everywhere they travel and enjoy attending geo-events wherever they go.

Kris found out about Geocaching when a family acquaintance sent a Christmas letter that mentioned their adventures in Geocaching. Then, their son and his best friend found one by accident. Soon after, they followed them to their first find! It was 2007 and they used GPSrs to navigate and index cards to write down the coordinates!

About their geo-nick. Brian signed up and didn't consult with Kris on the name. Zoot Horn Rollo was the stage name of a guitarist who was a protégé of Frank Zappa and part of the band called Captain Beefheart. Look at that again. It's not "Zoo-thorn-rollo". No wonder their abbreviated signature is ZHR!

The next time you find yourself at the San Antonio Riverwalk, just down the way from La Villita full of shops and restaurants, you'll find Stage 1 of this LOVE-ly little multi. After you take in all of the sites surrounding you right at GZ – from the beautifully painted mural along the river, to the riverboats as they float underneath your feet, to the varied styles of architecture – challenge yourself by using all your geo-senses and skills to locate the lovelock that will give you the KEY to the final location.

As the cache description says, "...located near the Court House Chapel. After lovers say their "I do's" and tie the knot, they profess their love even more by placing a lock on the fence with their initials and date and throw away the key- into the river."

And, if you are in the market for a lovelock - guess what - there is a shop that sells them steps away from the posted coordinates!





When we finished the Texas County Challenge in 2010 (Finisher 26), we were excited and proud, but little did we know what was ahead! We drive and camp in our travels and avoid Interstate Highways and big cities, so we are able to roam.

We started 2025 with 44 completed states, (and finds in 12 Canadian Provinces) and decided to set the goal of completing the Lower 48. We like to visit National Parks, state capitals, Presidential libraries, and small-town museums as well as roadside attractions and "The World's Largest" anything.

Some of the bumps in the road included: CT changing county boundaries, ANY island county, two counties being changed, which left holes in our maps.

It is that time of year again!

It is time to nominate candidates to succeed outgoing Board Members.

Board Members serve two-year terms that start at Challenge and end at Challenge two years later. Each year, we hold elections and elect people to fill half of the positions on the Board to help support continuity.

Here is an excerpt from the By-Laws on the process:

### Section 3 (a) Term Durations

The President and Vice President terms are two years. They may serve no more than two consecutive full terms, or until they decide to leave the Board, or until they are asked to vacate the position.

### Section 4 (a) Election of President, Vice President and Regional Representatives

During even numbered years, the offices for Vice President and Regional Representatives for Southeast Texas, Central Texas and West Texas will be elected. Any voting member may be elected. Any voting member may be nominated for President or Vice President. Any voting member living in the region they intend to serve may be nominated for Regional Representative. A nominated person must accept the nomination before being placed on a ballot.




