In the Fall of 2025, I took an epic European geocaching trip. I spent weeks planning a route that would take me to as many countries as possible and visit many of the famous cities in Europe. My plan focused on different cache types, oldest caches, most FP, etc. Fortunately, what I found is, if you focus on the city centers, you can typically find many interesting caches, see fantastic architecture and culture, eat great food, and generally have an amazing time.

I am happy to share the details, routes or logistics for anyone that is willing to listen – but for this article, I thought I would share some of the best experiences vs. a travelogue.



Going in - I was most nervous about the driving. My route ended up being 2400kms and I was typically driving from sunup to sundown. If you read my previous Story Board story, you know I have a checkered past with rental cars - to say the least. In fact, thinking back on my history, it is kind of shocking that companies will even rent me a car. Fortunately, on this trip, the car was returned with no damage! However, there were numerous close calls (all my fault), multiple efforts to park my tiny rental in ridiculously small spaces, a terrifying drive in the Dolomites, and a small incident in Switzerland (I called this Almost International Incident #1) where I ended up in a pedestrian only zone and then a zone where only electric trams are allowed. In many of these situations, I was helped along by friendly locals showing me what to do with emphatic hand gestures and shouted words of encouragement (at least that is what I believe they were doing)!

I saw some incredible sights during my trip – each of the cities in which I stopped was amazing – I have a particular soft spot for Warsaw (Poland), Budapest (Hungary), Innsbruck (Austria), the Dolomites (Italy), Switzerland, Luxembourg and Nancy (France). I will particularly remember Switzerland despite having some of the most frightening moments.



around what I called the urban assault vehicle (think about a cross between an RV and a tank) and many police cars. I got back to the car and started following Google maps out of town and suddenly all those cars came blasting up the road with full sirens led by the urban assault vehicle. Of course, they all turned left where I needed to turn and jumped out in full riot gear and blocked the street. Google maps said "turn left" but the policemen were not interested in that plan, so I turned right and Google maps promptly redirected me around the block and right back to the same corner – this happened several times. Finally, the police let me, and a few other cars make the left turn, and as I was driving down the street, I heard several very loud booms from the urban assault vehicle, and a crowd of people came running up the stairs holding their shirts over their nose and mouths. As the old saying goes: "My momma didn't raise no fool." I know when the party is over and it is time to leave. I was able to weave my way through the mess and get out of Basel. I never did find out what was going on – I assume it was some kind of protest that the police decided was over. I was just glad to get out unscathed!

Almost International Incident#2 happened as I was leaving Basel (Switzerland) and walking back to my car. I noticed a very large number of policemen on the side of the road hanging out casually

Meeting new and interesting people is really one of the best parts about geocaching. In addition to the people I met at different events, I had several other memorable encounters along the way: In a café in Warsaw (Poland), I sat next to and chatted with a German couple that was there to visit some of the death camps from WWII because they felt it was their obligation as Germans to understand what had happened under their former leaders. In the countryside of Austria, I met a local man that was mowing the lawn of his family winery. (In this area of the country every family has their own winery.) Although he spoke no English, he invited me in for a beer and showed me his family's wine making operation, and I explained geocaching to him. Alcohol is a great lubricant for conversations when neither party speaks the others language! In Innsbruck (Austria), I had dinner with members of TeamPumpJack's family and had an amazing meal and one of the first opportunities on my trip to relax. In Maastricht (The Netherlands), I met a local who was completely dressed in KC Chief gear. We started talking, and it turns out he grew up about 30 minutes from where I was raised. However, the coolest interaction was in Joinville, France. Once I had my itinerary planned out, I shared it with some of my European friends asked them if they wanted to come along on my trip. Kevin Carlier (many of you have met him at Challenge over the past several years) reached out and made a counterproposal: Could I attend his wedding in France? Of course I had to attend, so I made some changes to the plan and arrived at the wedding much to the surprise of many of the attendees! It turned out to be one of my favorite memories from the trip. Following the wedding and 6 days of nonstop caching and travel, I was worn out. The last day was a blur, and I headed to the Frankfurt airport for an early dinner and to get some rest before jumping on another flight back across the "pond".

This one has room for trackables and great swag. It's good for newbies and veteran cachers alike.

25 Years of Texas Challenges

A little over 25 years ago, a group of cachers (UsMorrows, 9Key, Cybercat, CacheReward, and Moosiegirl) got together and came up with an idea of creating a statewide event that celebrated geocaching. In addition to the fun and fellowship, the centerpiece of this event was a competition to determine annual bragging rights for the “Best Geocaching” group in Texas. The winning team was awarded the Golden Ammo Can.

Over the years this event has morphed and evolved but the core idea remains, and Texas Challenge is the longest running event of its kind and the longest running Mega event.

From March 9 -14, 2027, TXGA will be celebrating our 25th Annual Texas Challenge in San Angelo, TX. To help commemorate this incredible milestone TXGA is announcing a special caching project - *25 Years of Texas Challenges*. TXGA will be releasing a series of 25 Anniversary Caches. Each of these caches will celebrate one of our 25 Texas Challenges. In addition to the normal contents - each cache will contain a passport and a special punch that corresponds to that year’s event. The first 25 people to complete their Passport will receive a commemorative coin that will be awarded at the 25th Texas Challenge in March 2027. Once you have completed your passport – send a picture of your passport to the following address for validation **25yrsOfChallenges@TexasGeocaching.com**. Who knows - there may also be some other interesting prizes available along the way, so pay attention to the contents of the caches and cache pages!
