If you follow [TXGA on Facebook](#) you have heard about this month's story which demonstrates the best of the best geocachers in the State of Texas! Here's the inside scoop as told by all the parties involved!



It all started with a message to our TXGA Facebook page:
"I believe I lost my wedding ring at a geocache site in Stephenville. This may be a long shot, but if anyone finds it, can you please let me know?"

My name is Michele Warner (MaineWildWoman), and my husband is Aaron Warner (HootyMaToody). We were visiting Texas from Maine during our daughter's winter break. She's considering moving here after high school, so we planned the trip to explore the area a bit more.

We were staying in Fort Worth and decided to drive down to Glen Rose to visit the wildlife park and stop at a few geocache sites along the way, including one near Stephenville ([GC11824](#)). At one of the stops, I had put lotion on and must have set my wedding ring on my pants without realizing it. When I got out of the car at the geocache site, it must have fallen off.

From there, we continued on to a Masonic Lodge historical site and then spent the afternoon at the wildlife park in Glen Rose. We explored the town and even visited a couple more geocache locations before I realized my ring was gone.

We went back through our photos and videos and were able to narrow it down to either the geocache site near Stephenville or the Masonic Lodge site. We were unable to go back to any of the sites because we had to leave our hotel early in the morning to catch our flight the next day. I began reaching out to every organization and establishment we had visited. That's when I found the Texas Geocaching Association's Facebook page.

The kindness and willingness of strangers to help us search is something I will never forget. We were just about to give up hope after hearing that the initial searches had come up empty, and it seemed like all efforts might lead nowhere.

Then my husband called me with the news — my ring had been found!

Two incredible geocachers from Austin took time out of their busy lives to search for a ring that belonged to someone they had never met. When we heard, we both cried.

We are beyond blessed and deeply grateful for everyone who helped, shared posts, searched, and cared. Your kindness restored our faith in people, and we will carry that gratitude with us always.

The first Texas geocachers on the scene:

Cheri Tummelson (CrazyChickC and the South Texas Rep for TXGA) her wife, Sandy Farnham (OneCrazyChick), and their pup "Roo" were in Glen Rose for Cheri's participation in the Mammoth March, a 20-mile hike through Dinosaur Valley State Park on that Sunday. Cheri noticed the conversation on the TXGA FB messenger page and since it was only 30 minutes from where they were, planned to head to the area where the ring was lost on their way home on Monday. They contacted Michele to get more information and stayed in contact with her and Aaron. On Monday, Cheri and Sandy hunted both the cache location and the Masonic Lodge for a total of 1.5 to 2 hours without the aid of a metal detector with no luck.



Now, hear from HiDude_98 and Mrs_HiDude on their hunt:

On Sunday February 22, I happened to notice a Facebook post to the Centex Geocachers Group. I read through the post that the HootyMaToody couple lost her wedding ring at cache [GC11824](#). They are from Maine and after an exhaustive unsuccessful search for the ring in the rental car, they were forced to abandon the search to catch their flight back home. The post really called to me for many reasons: The desire to help out others, the challenge it presented (most know I love a good challenge) and pain in my heart knowing what the couple must be going through due to the lost wedding ring. I have a very good metal detector, extremely bright flashlights and I'm in my element when night caching.

Mrs_HiDude arrived home around 5pm and I asked her, "How do you feel about making a six hour round trip drive for a cache?". She scoffed and retorted with a "No! I have a meeting at 5am tomorrow!". I asked her to read the Facebook post and she immediately said, "Ok, but we need to leave now or very soon." I let her know I pinged Ca\$hQueen, whom had posted the call out for help, for some additional details before we committed to the trip. She had pinged HootyMaToody, with my questions, and we were waiting for a response. We didn't get one that night, so we didn't head out.

The next day, I got a text from CrazyChickC and OneCrazyChick. They were about thirty minutes away and about to head towards home, but were planning to stop by for a search. They wanted to know if we had already tried or were on our way. It was at that time we also heard back from Ca\$hQueen. We shared the details we had, and they gave it the first good long search. They didn't have a metal detector with them. They communicated directly with HootyMaToody and got quite bit more specifics on where the car was parked and the path she took after getting out of the car. They were unsuccessful on their search, so I talked with Mrs_HiDude and we quickly put a plan together to give it a try. (cont'd next page)

We both cancelled our end of day work calls and left the house at 5pm. We grabbed some fries and a drink at Whataburger on the way and continued to listening to a book on tape that we started last weekend. Just south of Briggs on 281, a massive accident occurred that required STAR flight. This held us up for awhile, but eventually we were able to find some back country roads to get us around the complete shutdown. We were not going to be deterred in our goal at this point! We got to GZ around 7:45pm. I parked about 100 feet south of the cache, as to not accidentally park on the ring (I've parked over evil cache hides in the past). It was about 45 degrees at the time and windy. I had brought my hoody and put it on when we arrived, but as usual, I was in flip flops and shorts.

We first found the cache, and we knew they had parked the car across from that point, with her on the passenger side, facing away from the cache. The belief was that the ring was lost when she got out of the car there, walked around the back of the car and searched for the cache. We also knew that she started searching from 30 feet left of the cache. So, we first focused wandng the ground on the opposite side of the road with the metal detector. I slowly wanded the ground, 75 feet in each direction and about 6-8 feet from the road out into the weeds. You'd be amazed at just how many aluminum cans, bottle caps, bailing wire, gum wrappers, etc. there are along the side of a country road. Every time the metal detector buzzed, we dug up the area only about two inches deep as it was very unlikely to covered by more than that. We struck out and we moved to the side of the road where the cache was and did the repeated the same. This time, I also wanded the section thirty feet to the left of the cache, from the road to the fence. Still nothing.

An hour had passed and Mrs_HiDude was freezing, so she went back to the jeep to warm up while I pressed on. At this point, my back needed a break, so I took my flashlight, set it to the brightest setting and placed it next to my eyes. This is best for night caching so that I can immediately see any glint back. My thought was now, I'm going to go 150 feet in each direction on both side of the road, in the event the ring landed on the road and one of the many vehicles kicked it up and sent it down the road further than it originally was. I focused on the road and mostly the section of rocks along the road (which extended about 3-4 feet from the asphalt on each side). Quite a few trucks had passed by during our search with many stopping to ask what we were doing and if we were ok. After telling them that we were searching for a lost wedding ring, they wished us luck and drove on.

I continued this search pattern for next thirty or so minutes, extending my search further down the road in each direction and further out into the grass on each pass. I was about 75-100 feet to the north of the cache, on the expected opposite side of the road, when I caught a glint of something on the very edge of the road, in the asphalt. There was the ring, laying in the bottom of little pocket in the asphalt at the edge of the road! Woo Hoo!!

I was far enough away that Mrs_HiDude didn't see me find it, so I played it cool and walked about to the jeep. She asked if I was taking a break to warm up. I responded with yes, and could you please hold this for a minute while I warm up? She held her hand out and I placed the beautiful wedding ring in her hand. We called HootyMaToody and shared the news and wow what a great conversation that was. We were in amazing spirits for the ride home, listening to the book on tape and recounting our adventure. We ended up getting home at 12:45am. I'm so grateful to have been able to use my skills, determination and totts to help out a couple from another state!

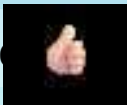
